Teacher of the Month - Johnny Mok

1. What do you love the most about teaching?

The thing I love most about teaching is when I see a student's eyes light up from being able to resolve a technical issue. The smile on their face is what I'm sure every teacher lives for, as do I.

2. How do you inspire your students to practice more?

I try to act as a role model for my students and let them know that I'm doing everything that they are. As we tackle a difficult piece of music, the fundamental problems are usually what keeps us from going forward. But, the difference between a teacher and a student is that the teacher just happens to have a little more experience in tackling these hardships. Therefore, as a teacher and artist, I'd continue to keep as active as possible to show my students that anything is possible with a little guidance and persistence!



3. What part do you feel that the recital experience plays in a student's development?

Well there are two ways to look at a recital experience. The first perspective is that students have a platform to show their families their progress as they study the art of cello playing.

The second perspective is as a motivation for the student to help him or her learn to develop a quicker pace in musical problem-solving, in time for a performance. Of course, recital experience may sometimes be stressful, but I truly believe that this kind of stress can be managed! I can provide that assistance!

4. What is your favorite type of music?

Other than Classical, I love Big Band, and Latin music. In fact, one of my favorite artists is Frank Sinatra. His voice is truly one of the greatest treasures of popular music culture history.

5. Tell us about an ensemble that you are playing in!

I'm currently playing with a few orchestras in the US. Orchestral playing can be one of the most rewarding experiences in cello playing, and most important of all, it requires teamwork, and that's my favorite kind of work!

6. If you could give a quick tip to cello students, what would it be?

Cello playing seems hard at first, but often times we tend to over-complicate certain concepts. So remember... Don't work hard, work smart!
